WHEREAS, Natomas Unified has been identified by *The New York Times* as the second most diverse school district in the nation;

WHEREAS, in the United States and around the world there has been an increase in violence in churches, synagogues, mosques, Sikh Temples, and other places of worship, and anti-semitism - and the effects these tragedies have on our students, staff and community;

WHEREAS, a Natomas Unified Core Belief is *Our diversity is a strength, and;*

WHEREAS, the Governing Board's Vision states, "All NUSD students graduate as college and career ready, productive, responsible, and engaged global citizens," ([Board Policy 0000: Vision](#)) and the Governing Board affirms that this Vision is irrespective of students' immigration status, language, ethnicity, race, religion, sexual orientation, ability, sex and gender identity, socioeconomic status or beliefs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Natomas Unified School District that:

Trustees commit to the idea that no religious belief or nonbelief shall be promoted or belittled by the school system or its employees. All students and staff members shall be tolerant of the views of others and not discriminate against anyone for a religious viewpoint or lack of a religious viewpoint as ensured in Board Policy 0410 NONDISCRIMINATION IN DISTRICT PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES where it is stated "All individuals shall be treated equitably in the receipt of district and school services."
